But, let's go back to the verse I mentioned at the beginning from 2 Thess 3:16 ... may he give us peace at **ALL** times and in **EVERY** situation! Again, those words rang loud as we left camp today. God was definitely there at all times all week and we pray for these kids that they will experience God's peace in whatever circumstance they returned home to - **a peace that only He can give**.
